Recreation Facilities Announced

Specifications on Mission Viejo Company's newest recreational facilities at The Lakes, Arizona, and Mission Viejo, Colorado, were recently announced by Jerry Curran, director of recreation systems, Mission Viejo Company.

Construction of The Lakes' Beach and Tennis Club will begin March 1. Completion is planned for mid-summer of this year.

The new 12,555-square-foot building will be located on a four-acre site overlooking The Lakes' waterways. Its two-story design will include two indoor, four-wall enclosed handball courts, a physical fitness room, Swedish saunas, lounge and billiard area and a large meeting room.

In addition to the facilities, the building will offer a multi-purpose room with adjacent kitchen area for dances, meetings and classes, a spacious crafts and hobby room and snack shop.

Three lighted tennis courts, a 4,500 square-foot swimming pool with sundeck, volleyball

court, jacuzzi and barbeque area also are planned for the site.

The new club is for all homeowners at The Lakes.

Mission Viejo, Colorado's recreation center is planned for the first phase of development in the new 640-acre community. It will be completed when the initial model complex opens in July.

Its contemporary design will incorporate an enclosed indoor swimming pool which will open on the sides depending upon weather conditions. Also planned in its initial design are six tennis courts, physical fitness room, children's play yard, adult lounge and sundeck.

The second phase of the center's development will include three indoor handball courts, a multi-purpose gymnasium and two meeting rooms. Its 16,553-square foot building will be located on a seven-acre site within the totally-planned community.

"This will be one of the most outstanding facilities of the five recreation centers designed by Mission Viejo Company," said Curran. "It also will be completely unique to any single-dwelling home community."

The Colorado recreation center will offer optional membership to homeowners.
