OPENING DAY AT DANA HILLS HIGH SCHOOL

High school residents of Mission Viejo who live south of Oso Parkway entered their new Dana Hills High School in the Capistrano School District on January 3rd. Architecturally innovative, the school occupies 38 acres of rolling hills overlooking the Pacific and Salt Creek. It features departmental complexes with no walled boundaries, piped-in music, carpeted hallways, large pop-art graphics identifying departments, and rooms opening into the large central mall for assemblies and lunching.

Mr. Walt Spencer, proud principal of the new school reported 1194 students now enrolled and termed opening day "very smooth." Last spring the staff went to work and advisory committees consisting of students, parents and staff established goals and objectives for each department. The actual move into the completed building took place during the Christmas recess.

Students are designing the landscape, building kilns in the art department and helping set up the library. A special "student hour" at the end of each day is devoted to special interest activities, such as lab, library, music, or extra assistance from teachers.

Many Mission Viejo youths are active in the Dolphin Band, student government and sport activities. Parents involved in the PTSA include Mrs. Adonna Kimmel, president; Mrs. Dorothy Fogerty, treasurer and Mrs. Dee Dee Leif, newsletter editor. The Dolphin Band Club and Boosters include Mission Viejo parents in leadership positions. The PTSA sponsored "Premier Night" on January 27 to introduce the community to the new school and raise extra funds needed for a media center.



DANA HILLS HIGH SCHOOL — which officially opened its classrooms to students January 3, offers a multi-purpose mall area where students can enjoy lunch, dances, meetings, and assemblies, or relax while waiting for class. Surrounding the center are planters with greenery and landscaping provided by the high school's horticulture students. The new high school currently has a student body of 1194. Next year's enrollment is expected to reach the facility's capacity with more than 1700 students.
