MV Activities Committee plans St. Paddy's Parade

Mission Viejo residents with just a wee bit of Irish in them and those who wish they had, are invited to join in planning the annual St. Paddy's Parade.

Sponsored by the Mission Viejo Activities Committee, the parade will begin at 2 p.m. Saturday, March 15, and will feature bands, floats, marching groups, and equestrian units.

Dr. Ted Witt and Marty Russo, chairmen of the event, have asked residents to begin thinking about their entry ideas. Entry blanks are required, and may

The parade will begin at Mission Viejo High School and will proceed south on Chisanta to Estanciero where it will go to Marguerite before turning south to Oso Parkway and Montanoso where it will disband.

Two concession stands, one near the beginning of the route and one along Oso Parkway, have been planned. The judging stand also will be along Oso Parkway.

Capistrano Unified to construct new Mission Viejo high school

Capistrano Unified School District's Board of Trustees has approved the conceptual design for a new high school in Mission Viejo on Via Escolar, south of Saddleback College.

The high school, on a 40-acre lot, will house a projected enrollment of 2,400 students, according to a district spokesman.

The plan calls for the construction of a multi-level build-

ing with a separate gym. Other supplemental buildings also may be erected in the future.

Construction bids are planned for next fall with Sept. 1977, as the target date for opening the first increment of the school.

William Blurock and Partners Construction Co., the same firm that built Dana Hills High School, also in the CUSD, has been given the contract to design the new facility.

Miner's Village theme chosen for new center

That earthmoving going on at the intersection of La Paz Road and Marguerite Parkway is laying the groundwork for a 50,000 sq. ft., specialty - retail - service development, according to John Younkin, Mission Viejo Co. director of commercial development.

The theme for the new center, a miner's village, will be carried throughout the two buildings. Centered around a courtyard, a "shaft" will carry patrons to different levels of the buildings, which will be connected by a walkway bridge.

Scheduled for opening in the fall, the new facility will house approximately 45 tenants offering unique and specialty items. Among the expected shops will be antiques, house plants, gifts, women's fashions, hair fashions, an international flavor delicatessen, a restaurant, and professional and business offices.

The site is being developed by Real Estate Technology Inc. of Beverly Hills, with John Wells of Newport Beach as the architect.

Mission Viejo Manager of Recreation, Clay Woods, who serves on the Center's fund raising committee, arranged to have a new stove donated to the center.

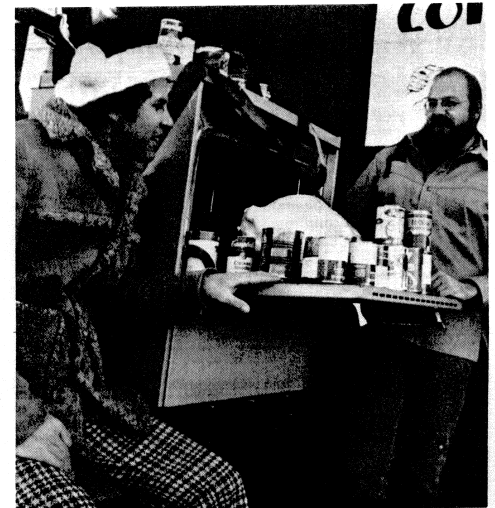
"We can appreciate the work the volunteers at the Comitis Crisis Center are doing for the Aurora community, and as a part of that community, we wanted to help," Woods explained.

Center Director Richard Barnhill and a volunteer force of 20 persons have refurbished the

"We had eight persons living here last Christmas and we usu-

ally get 60 calls and 25 walk-ins per day. We really need and appreciate all help," Barnhill stated.
