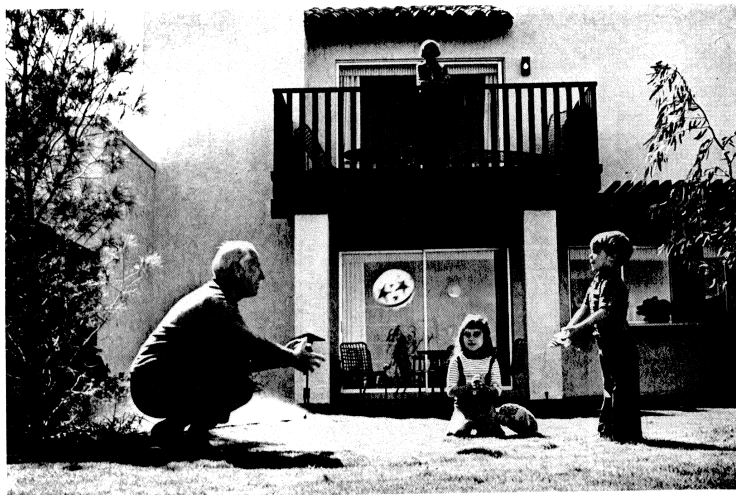
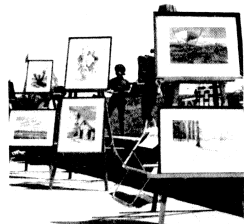
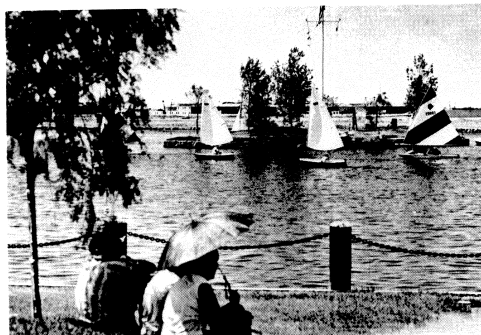

ASU student Alex Ross who received college honors for competition in swimming and water polo, has joined the staff as lifeguard and swim team coach.

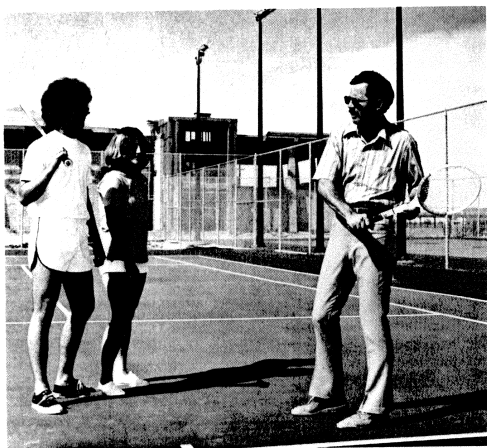

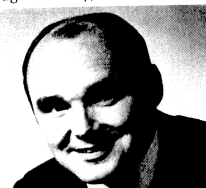
Carner's net home sales for the month were 33 with a net dollar volume of \$964,495.
