Models Under Construction in Aurora

Model construction has begun at Mission Viejo's new planned community in Aurora, according to Bud Williams, project manager, Building Systems Division, Colorado.

Nine models are being built, featuring extensive use of heavy wood exterior beams and distinctive architecture. The one, two-story and tri-level homes with two or three bedrooms will feature formal entryways, vaulted ceilings and large master bedroom suites.

Williams noted that grading for the first unit of homes has been completed, and that water and sewer lines have been installed.

Construction has also begun on the community's recreation center. Complete with an indoor competition size swimming pool, physical fitness rooms for men and women, and outdoor tennis courts, the center will be completed and ready for use by the first residents when they move in later this year.

While model construction is underway, a temporary sales office will be open to provide information on the homes, and, later, to take reservations, Williams said. The temporary sales

office will be open in about three weeks.

Snow Storm in M.V.

April 25 Mission Viejo, Aurora, Colorado, was basking in 70-degree sunshine. Twenty-four hours later, it was buried under massive snow drifts as high as 15 feet.

"The project became isolated and company personnel undertook 'rescue efforts' to locate and bring out those who were completely bogged down in the snow," stated Jeff Lodder, director of operations, Environmental Systems Division, Colorado. Power in the Aurora/Denver area was sporadic with numerous black-outs reported. Freeways were blocked-off, and nearby Stapleton Airport was forced to close down.

Fortunately, the storm was temporary. Progress at the 640-acre community was not hindered, and everyone is alive and well in Mission Viejo, Colorado.

Bowers Exhibit

Bowers Museum presents Sung, Ming, Ch'ing; China, Japan, Tibet; and jade, ivory, porcelain and bronze, elements of an exhibit totalling eighty pieces currently on display at the Santa Ana museum.

Highlighting this exhibit is a loan collection from San Francisco of twenty-nine pieces ranging from a 13-foot 9-inch high scroll and a 4½-inch diameter ceramic bowl created during the Sung Dynasty (960-1279 A.D.), to several items, including an elegant, matching pair of 22-inch high vases from the Ch'ing Dynasty (1644-1912).

This collection is joined and complemented by works from the museum's permanent collection, including a tusk over six feet tall carved in the theme of the Taoist Eight Immortals, and 43 items loaned by local collectors.

Bowers Museum is located at 2002 North Main Street, Santa Ana. Hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; Sunday, 1 to 5 p.m.; and Wednesday and Thursday, 7 to 9 p.m. Closed Monday. No admission charge.

Grand Opening at The Lakes
