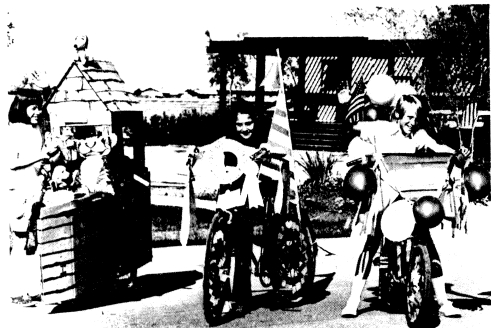
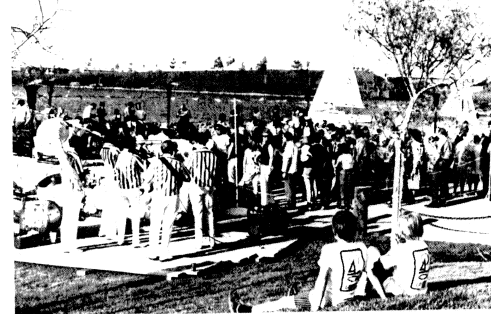

Exchange Club Donates Freedom Shrines

Installation of Freedom Shrines in public and private buildings is one of the important yearly projects of the 134 Exchange Clubs of California. Most of the Freedom Shrines are installed in schools, allowing students of all ages to view our American Heritage.

The Freedom Shrine is a unique exhibit of twenty-eight authentic reproductions of historically famous American documents spanning the 325 years from the Mayflower Compact to the World War II Instrument of Surrender in the Pacific.

The Freedom Shrine is exclusively an Exchange Club project, and an important part of the overall American Citizenship program of Exchange.

Bill Kohler, California District Four Chairman of the Freedom Shrine Committee and vice president of the local Saddleback

Valley Club, stated that Division Four, including all of Orange County, will install over forty Freedom Shrines. This will exceed all divisions in the state and the nation.

The Saddleback Valley Club will install two Freedom Shrines in Viejo Elementary School and Valencia Elementary School. These presentations are made available through the assistance of Bob Dameron, M & M Financial Consultants, Tom Winget, Mission Bank and Dr. Louis Haslwanter through the co-sponsorship plan.

Nadadores Score

The Mission Viejo Nadadores scored big at the North Las Vegas Tenth Annual Spring Invitational, March 25 through 27.

The Nadadores placed seventh in swim competition with forty-one teams from California, Ohio, Utah, Idaho, Texas, Arizona, Nevada and Colorado.

Capturing first place with a new meet record was the eight years and under boys 100 meter medley relay with a time of 1:19.62. Members of the winning team were Tim Hugar, Jeff Alfrich, Steve Ronco and John Conti. The boys also led the 100 meter free relay with a 1:09.61.

13-year-old Cathy Howe swam to first place in the girls open 1500 meter free style. She later placed fifth in the 200 meter free and fourth in the 200 meter IM.

John Conti, aged 7, placed second in the 50 meter fly, sixth in the 50 meter back, and third in the 100 meter free and 100 meter IM.

Geoff Lee placed seventh and Mark Howe, eighth, in the boys 11 years and under 400 meter free.

Placing fourth in the eight years and under girls 50 meter fly was Cathy O'Reilly. She also took fifth place in the 100 meter IM.

Steve Ronco took third place in the boys eight years and under 50 meter breast, and fifth in the 50 meter free.

Tim Hugar placed fourth in the boys eight years and under 50 meter back.

In the boys 9 to 10 aged group, Mike Scolman took fifth in the 50 meter fly and sixth in the 100 meter free. Mark Howe placed sixth in the 200 meter free and sixth in the 50 meter breast.

Shawn O'Gorman, in the boys 11 to 12 aged group, placed fourth in the 100 meter back and fifth in the 200 meter IM.

Progress Report, Aurora, Colorado

Jeff Lodder, director of Environmental Systems Division, operations, Mission Viejo, Colorado, recently announced that overhead power lines are scheduled to be removed this month — at the expense of Mission Viejo Company — from Chambers Road to Kalispell Street, a distance of 1200 feet.

Grading has been completed on the first unit of homes and sewer and water lines installed. Construction will begin May 1.

The recreation facility, designed by Mission Viejo Company, will begin construction sometime in May.
