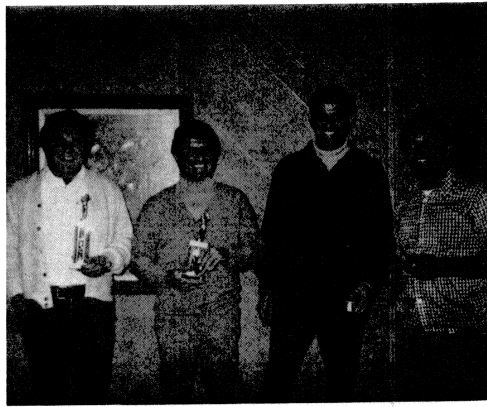


COMMUNITY CAPERS...COLORADO
