

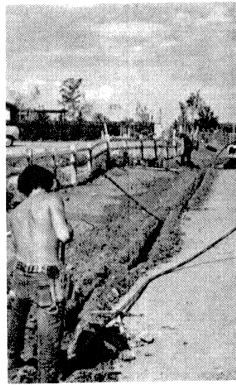

GREENBELTS TO ADD AESTHETIC APPEAL

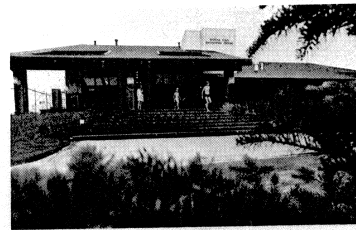
Greenbelts, which have been designed to meander throughout the community of Mission Viejo, are currently under construction in Mission Viejo, Colorado.

The areas will feature 4' wide concrete walkways, trees and abutting yards with split rail fencing. The walkways connecting to major parts of interest such as the recreation center and future library, will include complete lighting for night safety.

The three acres of greenbelt area will also lead to the new elementary school which is adjacent to a 2-acre park site, both of which are due to open this month.

An informative program on the City of Aurora provided the kick-off for the year for the newly formed Mission Viejo Women's Club.

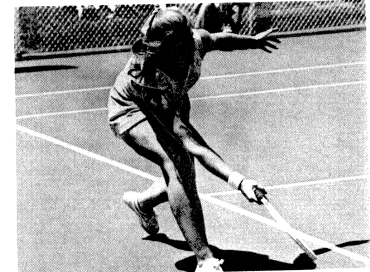
Speaker Mary O'Dell addressed 30 members of the club at a salad luncheon Friday, August 3, in the newly completed recreation center.

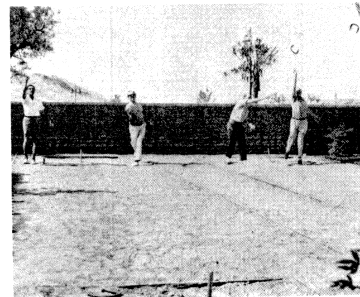
