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October Board Meeting Notes

At the October Board meeting, we learned, regrettably, that our Treasurer Fiona Biggs will not be able to continue serving next year. Barbara Ferris and Dave Goss are eligible for re-election, and both are willing to continue. Rich Yeager, who has been on a leave with the Board is also not able to continue. Twila Filipiak who has been filling in for Rich is willing to serve and will be nominated for election. Therefore, we will have two vacancies to fill.

The Board's finances are still strong with more than \$20,000 in our account. However, we will be placing an order for new blocks to be shipped from California. These are the wall replacement blocks that are needed whenever repairs to the walls are required. Toward the end of the year, we will also be prepaying for 2020 weed control with our contractor.

Newsletter Coordinator Kathy Bitzer shared with us concerns over the delivery of the newsletters. Five volunteers are having to stop delivering due to health concerns or other issues. She is looking at ways to combine routes and to seek additional volunteers. The Board also discussed at length the idea of going all electronic for the newsletter, with just a few hard copy complimentary issues placed at the library or other locations. The main problem is that the HOA does not have all member email addresses nor a way to obtain email addresses for the remainder of the Mission Viejo community. We will begin trying to compile an email distribution list which may take into 2020.

Barbara Ferris will be heading up the Traffic calming project. More than twenty households have volunteered to sign the petition that will need to be sent to the City of Aurora. Barbara will be contacting these households to form a small team to help work on this effort.

Dumpster day was another great success. More than 54 residents delivered approximately 15 tons of materials to be disposed. Clearly this is a valuable event and we will schedule two for next year. Additionally, the Board will also arrange for our first electronic recycling event to be held late next spring.

We have no additional updates from Pro Disposal as to any changes being contemplated for service in Mission Viejo. We are working with the company liaison and will keep you informed of changes when we learn of them.

Parking Etiquette

It seems as if the longer we live in a home, the more stuff we acquire. Sometimes, we have so much stuff that we fill our garages and have to move cars out on the driveway or in to the street. Sometimes we have several cars and finding a convenient parking space for each of them is difficult. This is especially true when many other cars are parked on the street as well. However, common courtesy is something we can all practice. If your street is crowded, with limited space, be thoughtful about your neighbors. We all like to park in front of our homes, but if you decide to park in front of someone else's home, especially if it's for more than a few hours or a day, consider talking to them about your plans. It can be frustrating when one neighbor continually uses someone else's home for their parking space. Unfortunately, trailers and inoperable vehicles also complicate the situation. Parking enforcement is the purview of the City of Aurora. The City of Aurora Code states that vehicles that are inoperable, partially dismantled, or damaged to the extent they cannot operate on public streets, cannot be stored outside on private property. All vehicles and trailers must be legally registered, display current plates, and all tires must be inflated. When it comes to parking, there are no easy answers to a congested parking problem within Mission Viejo. Be courteous and try to park the same way you'd like all your neighbors to park, with consideration and recognition that we all have to share the limited parking space around our homes.

A correction to a statement made in last month's Code Corner: Trash containers may be stored in the rear yard or out of site from the street. (NOT in the side yard of a residence

visible from the street.)

These are rules covered by City of Aurora codes. These are not Mission Viejo rules or HOA covenants but a requirement for all residents in the City. Access Aurora (303-739-7000) is way to report code violations anonymously and allow the City to enforce its own requirements. These types of code violations degrade the quality of life we enjoy in this special neighborhood. Please remember that City codes are the responsibility of all residents and enforcement is the way to maintain a desirable community. You aren't being selfish when you expect others around you to abide by the same rules that govern all residents in Aurora.

Try Interval Fasting to Lose Weight

Looking to lose weight and get healthier? Instead of counting calories, you might consider ADF—alternate-day fasting.

The Medical News Today website reports on a study that enrolled 60 people in a four-week trial. A control group could simply eat whatever they wanted, whenever they chose. The other group went on a schedule of a 36-hour fast followed by 12 hours of unrestricted eating.

Those in the second group experienced a 7.7-pound weight loss over the four-week study, along with lower levels of cholesterol and belly fat. Although on eating days they compensated for calories lost on fasting days, they didn't replace all the calories, leading to these and other health benefits.

A Safe Thanksgiving

When you fire up the oven to roast your Thanksgiving turkey, you're probably not thinking about tragedy. But home fires are the most common disaster in the United States, and cooking is the leading cause of those fires. Thanksgiving Day is the unfortunate host to about 4,000 fires each year. Here are some safety tips to keep your Thanksgiving fire-free:

- Stay in the kitchen and keep watch while you are cooking.
- Use a timer if you have something in the oven or are boiling or simmering something on the stove.
- Don't wear loose sleeves or loose clothing when cooking.
- Keep anything that can catch on fire—pot holders, oven mitts, towels, etc.—away from your stovetop or oven.
- Turkey fryers are extremely dangerous, and most safety organizations do not recommend their use.
- Make sure you have a smoke alarm installed with working batteries. Push the button to check that it's working every month, and install new batteries at least once a year.
- After your guests leave, do a home safety check to make sure that all candles are extinguished and all of your cooking appliances are turned off.

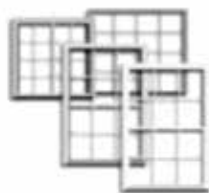

Juice and Soda Could add to Cancer Risk

Do you rely on a glass of fruit juice to get started in the morning and/ or a few cans of sugared soda to get through the afternoon? Bad news—CNN reports that just a third of a can of soda (110 ml) can lead to an 18% increase of cancer risk, and a 22% increase in breast cancer risk. Sugar, even in a glass of natural fruit juice, can contribute to weight gain and obesity, both risk factors for cancer.
