ALERT: Waste Connection Customers

Attention Waste Connections customers who were not prior ProDisposal customers! Waste Connections has an agreement with the Mission Viejo HOA to give \$2 per Mission Viejo customer each month to the HOA. When you sign up for Waste Connections as your trash and recycle service, you automatically belong to the MV HOA and consequently benefit the neighborhood through your membership. During the change-over from ProDisposal to Waste Connections, many customers needed to reconfirm their membership to ensure the payment to the HOA. Whether you are a new member or an old member, contacting Waste Connections to confirm your Mission Viejo HOA status is important.

The Covenants run with the land, so that any subsequent owners of property are subject to the same provisions as the original owners. East Quincy Avenue Needs Care

Mark October 9th on your calendar! On October 9 at 8:00 a.m. the HOA needs lots of volunteers to help pull weeds, lay fabric, and haul rocks in wheelbarrows from King Soopers to the drainage ditch. If you have looked at that area, you know that the weeds have taken over. The HOA pays for Ironwood EarthCare to spray the weeds, but after they are sprayed, the dead weeds still remain.

We need to have a group of volunteers to use spades and trowels to remove the dead weeds. Another group will need to place the large rocks onto the sidewalk. Then the fabric will be laid on that area and the rocks will be placed back on the fabric. Some new additional rocks will be added to the area. Those are the rocks that will be moved by wheelbarrow to the area. The HOA will purchase the additional rock that will be used to cover the fabric.

We hope that the homeowners who live on the other side of the fence in that area will volunteer to help that day, and we hope for additional volunteers from the Mission Viejo neighborhood. If you would like to volunteer, please email ElaineLay@missionviejohoa.org. We would like to finish this project on October 9th, and it is possible with enough volunteers. Mission Viejo Cookies for Everyone!

Because my family loves these cookies and hundreds of new residents have received these cookies over the years, it occurred to me this morning while making cookies that I should share these cookies with the neighborhood. Both were two of my Mom's favorite recipes!

TOLL HOUSE COOKIES WITH OATMEAL

1 cup shortening	¾ tsp. soda
¾ cup brown sugar	1 tsp. salt
¾ cup sugar	1 cup nuts (usually I skip nuts)
2 eggs	2 cups oatmeal
1 tsp hot water	1 tsp vanilla
1 ½ cups flour	6 or 12 oz. chocolate chips

Cream shortening and sugar. Add eggs and hot water. Stir in dry ingredients. Add nuts and oatmeal and chocolate chips. (in Colorado add about a half cup of flour. Bake on greased pan for 8 minutes at 375 degrees.

SNICKERDOODLES

½ cup shortening	2 tsp. cream of tartar
½ cup margarine	1 tsp. soda
2 eggs	¼ tsp. salt
2 ¾ cup flour	

Cream shortening, margarine, sugar and eggs. Then sift together and add the other ingredients. Chill. Then form in balls the size of walnuts. Roll in mixture of 2 Tbsp. sugar and 2 tsp. cinnamon. Bake 8 to 10 minutes at 350 degrees.

Slump Block Replenished by HOA

On September 4, 720 6x6x16 blocks and 216 8x6x16 blocks were delivered to the storage shed in the Seville Townhomes. Those 936 blocks had to be moved and put away in the shed in Seville. Both Mission Viejo and Seville townhomes benefit from these blocks. Every time a vehicle hits the walls around Mission Viejo, residents have a place from which to purchase the bricks. Vehicles hitting the wall around Mission Viejo seem to happen 3 or 4 times a year. The only place that these blocks can be purchased is from Indio, California. This year added a special complication with the difficulty and cost of shipping due to the "supply chain" problems which are nationwide. A big thank you goes to Shelby Lay, the resident that arranged the purchase and contacted all of the people that were involved. We thank Rob Tate who lives in Mission Viejo for arranging the transportation and Kris Wilcox, another Mission Viejo resident, for securing the forklift at a good price.

The next step in maintaining the appearance of the exterior walls is to make sure that the work on the walls is done by an experienced brick layer. If you look at these two examples of walls that have been repaired, you will see the difference that an experienced bricklayer can make.

Together with the HOA securing the slump block and experienced brick layers doing the work we can keep the appearance of Mission Viejo looking good enough to make this a neighborhood we are proud to live in! If you have a need for replacement blocks, please contact president@missionviejohoa.org.

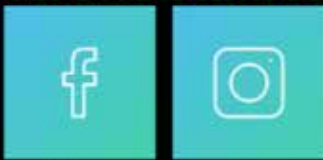

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Why Is Pumpkin Carving a Halloween Tradition?

Carved pumpkins are Halloween standards, but how did the jack-o'-lantern tradition get started? Learn about the history of Halloween and pumpkin carving.

For many of us, carving pumpkins is a must-do Halloween tradition. But have you ever wondered how the holiday tradition started? The history of Halloween as we know it is based on an ancient Celtic holiday known as Samhain. Celebrated at the end of summer, Samhain was a time to honor the deceased. Celts believed that from dusk on October 31 until the dusk of November 1, souls of those who had died that year would pass on, meaning it was also when ghosts would be most present. To ward away evil spirits, people placed carved jack-o'-lanterns on porches and in windows. Their creations were made from carved turnips, beets, or potatoes with burning lumps of coal inside them to add light.

Why Are They Called Jack-o'-Lanterns?

The term "jack-o'-lantern" is believed to have originated from an Irish myth about Stingy Jack, who played tricks on everyone. When he died, Jack was denied entry into both heaven and hell and was forced to roam the world as a ghost who carried a lantern made from a carved turnip. People used to carve turnips and other vegetables on Halloween until pumpkins (which offered more space for carving) became more available. These carved pumpkin creations eventually became known as jack-o'-lanterns, because of Stingy Jack who carried around his carved lantern.
