Notes From HOA Board Meeting August 2, 2021

The first meeting held at the Mission Viejo Library since March 2020 was attended by Board members Barbara Ferris, Deb Kirschbaum, Brenda Tompkins, Tia Davis-Burns and Elaine Lay. It was nice to see everyone in person again. Colette Bowdish joined the meeting via Zoom. There were 3 guests.

First on the agenda, during open forum, we discussed urban chickens. The MV covenants prohibit the keeping of chickens on one's property. But the City of Aurora allows urban chickens. There was discussion about the complexities of changing the covenants to allow. The work around would have those desiring chickens to gain permission from their neighbors. Also, to follow all the rules provided by the city of Aurora. Also discussed the risk of encouraging rodents and other urban wildlife with the addition of chicken habitat.

Brenda Tompkins is working on getting the financial records up to date since the recent change in officers.

Still trying to increase the participation in the Waste Connection Trash program. There are many Mission Viejo residents who use Waste Connections services but are not counted on the role for the \$2.00 monthly rebate to the HOA. There was discussion how this may be changed, but it all boils down to the individual resident MUST contact Waste Connection to confirm participation in the program. One shortcut is to use the Waste Connection website and request a call back to avoid time on hold. At this time Mission Viejo has 876 members enrolled in the program.

Barbara proposed getting renters insurance from the Self-Storage company to cover the items in the current storage unit. This includes all the Christmas decorations, service items needed for the Hayride and the annual meeting, signs to be placed around the neighborhood for annual events. The cost is reasonable at about \$12.00 per month for \$3000.00 coverage. The motion was carried and seconded.

The biggest thing on the HOA agenda is the purchase of replacement Slump Block. This block is unique and difficult to come by. It can be purchased from a company in the Los Angeles area and needs to be shipped here. The Block is not expensive, but the freight cost has increased 100% since the last shipment was received in 2019. The Blocks are stored in a garage in the Seville Townhomes. At this time, we need to negotiate with Seville to optimize space so that we can get a lot of blocks at one time to decrease the frequency of orders at this high shipping cost. Barbara will work on that.

The Hayride will be scheduled in December. We are looking at either December 11th or the 18th. Barbara will check with Blue Moon Carriages.

The new Pastor at Holy Love Lutheran church contacted us to volunteer services for work in the neighborhood for a community service project. It was suggested that the area directly across from the church, on the corner of the shopping center needed some attention. Also, if they would like to pull weeds and pick up trash heading north along Chambers. Barbara will send these suggestions.

Currently Mission Viejo HOA partners with the Neighborhood Association in Meadowood to collect the newsletters from the printer. It has been discussed on a few occasions that we partner with them on some sort of community project. We will get dates in mind and have a casual get together of the Boards to meet and discuss ideas and needs.

The unsightly weeds behind fences and along the curbs and sidewalks were discussed. The Weeds need to be either pulled or cut down. When that is done the Board agreed to have that area added to the weed control done by Ironwood Earthcare. Ultimately the area in question is the responsibility of the resident/homeowner. It was brought up that the HOA pays for weed control around homes that back on Mission Parkway and Alicia Parkway as well as Quincy, Hampden, and Chambers. Barbara will get a quote for the cost.

The next Dumpster Day is October 2, 2021.

We are considering having a table at the library once a month where board Members would be present to deliver HOA member discount cards and meet homeowners and residents. We are waiting to hear back from the Scheduling department at the library.

The issues of covenant violations came up. If no one brings the issue to the attention of the Board, either by email, phone, or the form on the HOA website, nothing will be done. The Board members do not drive around the neighborhood looking for violations. If something is seen a letter can be sent to the address in question. As always, Access Aurora is an option if it is a City Code violation. Community input is vital.

Paint Recycle Program

Looking through the Denver Post the other day I ran across an article about a company that will come to your home to pick up old paint for recycling. How very convenient!

PaintCare, for a limited time, will pick products to be recycled for free. There must be more than 10 gallons per address. Products accepted for pickup are defined as interior and exterior architectural coatings sold in containers of five gallons or smaller including: House paint and primers (latex or oil based), Stains, Deck and concrete sealers, clear finishes (vanishes, shellac).

PaintCare does not accept aerosol products, industrial maintenance original manufacturer, or specialty coatings.

Households with less than 10 gallons of paint for disposal are encouraged to use PaintCare's site locator tool to find a drop off site. There are more than 60 drop off sites around metro Denver. Or you could check with your neighbors to come up with an adequate amount for pick up.

Stormy Weather? Drive Safely

As fall approaches, wet weather may increase, which can make driving on slick, rainy roads treacherous. Follow this AAA-recommended advice for staying safe:

- **Plan ahead.** Check the weather and driving conditions before getting behind the wheel.
- **Be patient.** Traffic will be slower when rain is falling. Add in extra time to reach your destination so you don't have to rush.
- **Turn headlights on.** This doesn't just help you see the road better—it makes you more visible to other drivers. Don't use emergency flashers or high beams, though.
- **Drive slowly.** Even at 35 mph, your tires can lose contact with the road, causing your vehicle to start hydroplaning. To stay in control, slow down, avoid sharp turns, and drive in the tracks of vehicles ahead of you.
- **Don't use cruise control.** Cruise control in wet conditions can increase the risk of hydroplaning.
- **Keep a safe distance.** Allow extra space for you to stop if a vehicle ahead of you stops or swerves suddenly. Slow down early before coming to intersections or stop signs.
- **Pull over when necessary.** If the rain gets so fierce that you can't see ahead of your car, pull off the road and turn on your emergency flashers. Wait for the rain to subside.
- **Eliminate distractions.** As always, don't text, talk, or do anything that takes your attention from the road.

Code Corner

FENCES:

All fences must be maintained in good structural condition including pickets, rails, and posts.

A fence permit is not required for new or replacement fences under 6'6". However, installation of a new fence and/or replacement of an existing fence require owner/residents/tenants to adhere to the city's standards of construction, design, height, location & setback requirements. Prior to installing a fence, contact Colorado 811 at 1-800-922-1987 to locate buried utility services (cable, electrical, phone lines, gas lines, etc.) before digging.

GARAGE SALES:

Placing ANY "Garage Sale" signs on light poles, stop signs, Median strips, in parks or in any state "right of way" (Havana St, Parker Rd, Colfax Ave, 6th Ave) is prohibited. Up to four signs which may include addresses may be displayed to advertise a garage sale. Residents can only have FOUR sales per calendar year per address, for 72 consecutive hours. Items placed outside must be removed and stored in an enclosed structure by sunset each day.

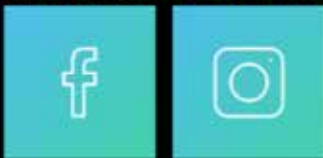
Keep Safety In Mind When You Travel

- **Check documentation requirements.** Double-check your airline's rules for vaccination, testing, quarantining, and other related requirements. Also confirm what's expected at your destination, especially if you're traveling internationally.
- **Eat and drink carefully.** Airlines still require masks during flight unless you're eating or drinking. Pack snacks for specific, scheduled meal breaks to maintain consistent mask use. Fill up your water bottles before the flight and make sure they're sturdy and don't leak.
- **Explore your destination in advance.** Find out what restrictions apply in the city, state, or country you're visiting. Many tourist attractions require reservations to prevent overcrowding, so make arrangements ahead of time. Follow local guidelines for masking and social distancing. Even as life starts returning to pre-pandemic "normal," it's smart to stay safe.
